Collect of the Day (2nd Sunday of Epiphany)

Almighty God, in Christ you make all things new: transform the poverty of our nature by the riches of your grace, and in the renewal of our lives make known your heavenly glory; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Psalm 139.1-6,12-18

¹ LORD, you have searched me out and known me; * you know my sitting down and my rising up; you discern my thoughts from afar.

² You trace my journeys and my resting-places * and are acquainted with all my ways.

³ Indeed, there is not a word on my lips, * but you, O LORD, know it altogether. ⁴ You press upon me behind and before * and lay your hand upon me. ⁵ Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; * it is so high that I cannot attain to it. ¹² For you yourself created my inmost parts; * you knit me together in my mother's womb.

¹³ I will thank you because I am marvellously made; * your works are wonderful, and I know it well. ¹⁴ My body was not hidden from you, * while I was being made in secret and woven in the depths of the earth. ¹⁵ Your eyes beheld my limbs, yet unfinished in the womb; all of them were written in your book; * they were fashioned day by day, when as yet there was none of them. ¹⁶ How deep I find your thoughts, O God! * how great is the sum of them! ¹⁷ If I were to count them, they would be more in number than the sand; * to count them all, my life span would need to be like yours. . ¹⁸ I try to count them-they are more than the sand; I come to the end- I am still with you..

Matthew 2.13-21

¹³ After the wise men had left, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, 'Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you; for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him.'

¹⁴ Then Joseph got up, took the child and his mother by night, and went to Egypt, ¹⁵ and remained there until the death of Herod. This was to fulfil what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet, 'Out of Egypt I have called my son.'

¹⁶ When Herod saw that he had been tricked by the wise men, he was

infuriated, and he sent and killed all the children in and around Bethlehem who were two years old or under, according to the time that he had learned from the wise men.

¹⁷ Then was fulfilled what had been spoken through the prophet Jeremiah: ¹⁸ 'A voice was heard in Ramah, wailing and loud lamentation, Rachel weeping for her children; she refused to be consoled, because they are no more.'

¹⁹ When Herod died, an angel of the Lord suddenly appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt and said, ²⁰ 'Get up, take the child and his mother, and go to the land of Israel, for those who were seeking the child's life are dead.'

²¹ Then Joseph got up, took the child and his mother, and went to the land of Israel.
