Psalm 104.24-35

²⁵ O LORD, how manifold are your works! * in wisdom you have made them all; the earth is full of your creatures. ²⁶ Yonder is the great and wide sea with its living things too many to number, * creatures both small and great.

²⁷ There move the ships, and there is that Leviathan, * which you have made for the sport of it. ²⁸ All of them look to you * to give them their food in due season. ²⁹ You give it to them; they gather it; * you open your hand, and they are filled with good things. ³⁰ You hide your face, and they are terrified; * you take away their breath, and they die and return to their dust.

John 1.1-14

¹ In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was in the beginning with God. ³ All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. ⁴ What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

⁶ There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. ⁷ He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him.

⁸ He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. ⁹ The

true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.
